



## **Account of Purley on Thames**

### **Chronicles 1375-1399-**

#### ***1375 - 48/49 Edward III***

Nicholas Carew the elder obtained a grant of Free Warren in his desmesne lands in Purley (refs 26, Charter roll 47-51 Edw II no 162 m 8 no 20, 233, 424-28661-176)

#### ***1376 - 49/50 Edward III***

#### ***1377 - 50/51 Edward III/1 Richard I***

Nicholas Carew was named as one of the executors of Edward III who had died senile and almost a pauper (refs Pt roll 1 Rich II pt iii m6; S26-III-418)

#### ***1378 - 1/2 Richard II***

#### ***1379 - 2/3 Richard II***

The remaining heirs of Sir Thomas Huscarle gave up their claims on the estate of Purley Magna in a quitclaim. One of these was Agnes Boukhede, his cousin who recognised the claims of Nicholas Carew the elder (S44-1379-320; ft fines Berks 45 Edw III no 76, S26-III-418 (Surrey RO 2163/7/13))

#### ***1380 - 3/4 Richard II***

#### ***1381 - 4/5 Richard II***

33 people in Purley paid a Poll Tax totalling £1.13.0 (ref 7 27/2/90)

Roger Zepeswych and William Kendale were administrators of the estate of John Rothewelle who had died intestate. They obtained a writ of Supersedeas by Mainprise of Reynold Sheffield, Henry Persones of Basildon, William Stynt of Basildon, John Percy of Purley and John Warde of Purley in favour of Adam Whelere of Basildon and Walter Croppethorne of Purley for render of 40 shillings (S44-1381-75)

#### ***1382 - 5/6 Richard II***

#### ***1383 - 6/7 Richard II***

Roger Watford left Purley and William Battersford became Vicar. They exchanged the livings of Purley and Wymering, Hants (near Portsmouth) The patron was Adam Charles, the Prior of St Edmunds in Salisbury (S115)

#### ***1384 - 7/8 Richard II***

William Battersford exchanged the living of Purley with Adam Wrockwardyn of Tytherington, near Thornbury in Gloucestershire. Adam came from a well known family with seats in Gloucestershire, Worcestershire and Warwickshire. They eventually became famous as the namesakes of Throgmorton St in London (S115)

Reynold Malyns died leaving the Manor of Purley Parva to his son Edmund. He had been made a Knight and acquired lands in Oxfordshire. The manor was said at the time to be held of Sir Robert Ferrers who appears to have been the head of the Sifrewast Fee in Berkshire. Reynold's widow was Florence. (Inq PM 8 Ric II no 29; S26-III-420; S424-28661-173)

### *1385 - 8/9 Richard II*

### *1386 - 9/10 Richard II*

Edmund Malyns died leaving a widow Isabella. The manor of Purley Parva passed to his grandson Edmund, younger son of Sir Edmund Malyns. The estate was settled on the young Edmund for life with reversion to his father's heirs and contingent remainder to Thomas Barentyne and his wife Joan (who was a daughter of Sir Edmund) for her son Reynold. (Chan. Inq PM 9 Ric II no 37; S26-III-420; S424-28661-173)

### *1387 = 10/11 Rich II*

William Smith became vicar of Purley, having exchanged livings with Adam Wrockwardyn who became vicar of Hannington near Kingsclere. (ref 115)

### *1388 - 11/12 Richard II*

One third of the Manor of Little Purley was ordered to be given in dower to Isabel, wife of Adam Ramesey and widow of Edmund Malyns. Isabel had recovered this from Thomas Barentyne, John Harewedaun et al. Edmund Malyns had apparently sold the manor to Thomas Barentyne without licence of the King. Adam and Isobel were pardoned for having married without first getting the King's permission. (S44-1388-391)

### *1389 - 12/13 Richard II*

### *1390 - 13/14 Richard II*

Nicholas Carew died and the Lordship of the manor of Purley Magna passed to his son Nicholas (Chan Inq PM 14 Ric II no 10; S26-III-418)

Following the death of Nicholas Carew, Richard II took away some of the rights from the Lords of Purley. He granted to Robert Cholmeley of the Farm, the form of the profits of the view of Franpledge from Purley, Burghfield, Sulham and Tidmarsh (S44-1390-300; S26-III-401; S100)

Thomas Bonelythe came to Purley as vicar from Chobham, Surrey, having exchanged livings with William Smith (S115)

### *1391 - 14/15 Richard II*

Stephen Atte Walle became Vicar of Purley having exchanged livings with Thomas Bonelythe who went to Hanefield in Sussex (S115-1391-136d)

Thomas Barentyne was pardoned for acquiring the manor of Purley from Edmund Malyns, deceased. He was given licence to Quitclaim two thirds of the manor to Edmund, younger son of Edmund Malyns, and one third to Isabel, Edmund's widow. (S100-1391-466)

### *1394 - 17/18 Richard II*

Stephen Atte Walle was summoned by John Waltham, Bishop of Salisbury, to appear before him at Sherborne Castle on August 17th. He was to answer the charge that he held a lady named Rose at the Vicarage in Purley as his concubine. Stephen went to Sherborne and affirmed that he had not touched her for over six years. However the Bishop instructed him to abjure her completely on pain of deprivation of benefice and confirmed an earlier order that Stephen should appear again at Sherborne on Sept 1st to do penance. (S115)

*1398 - 21/22 Richard II*

Nicholas Carew was exonerated of 46 shillings and 9 pence per annum of the custody of the King's Sects of Purley (Easter Red 21 Rich II; S233; S424-28661-176)

Nicholas Carew's first wife Isabel de la Mare had died (S26; S157-23785)

Walter Haywode conveyed the Manors of Sulham and La Hyde to Stephen Haym and Nicholas Carew. Nicholas and Hayme's daughter Mercy were married and the estates joined to Purley Magna Ft Fines Berks 22 Ric II no 12; S26-III-429)

Land in Great Purley was also granted to Nicholas and Mercy Carew by Thomas Warner, William Horneby, John Bremmesgrave. Clerk and John Cook of Winchester and also by Thomas Payne (S157-23785)

*1399 - 22/23 Richard II/ 1 Henry IV*

Edmund Malyns died and was succeeded as Lord of the Manor of Purley Parva by his eldest brother Reynold (Chan Inq PM 22 RicII no 30; S26-III-420, S424-28661-173)
