Reginald Malyns paid 10s re the Manor of Purley Parva which he held from the king for half a knight's fee (ref 106-57)

Stephen atte-Walle exchanged livings with John Miderhill who had been vicar of St Peter's, West Cliffe, near Dover since 1401. Stephen remained at West Cliffe until 1416 (ref 115-1405-98)

John Miderhill exchanged livings with Richard atte-Water, vicar of St Rumwold's Church in Winchester (ref 115-1406)

William Langespey was murdered by John and Gilbert Percy at Purley (ref 81)

Thomas Geoffray was instituted as vicar of Purley by the Archdeacon of Berkshire. He had exchanged livings with Richard atte-Water who went to Stantonbury (Bucks) near Wolverton (ref 115)

An entry in the Court Roll dated 7th May reported Nicholas Carowe and Richard atte-Lee have a lokke and a sewer at Purley'

Reynold Malyns conveyed the Manor of Purley Parva to Thomas and Alice Walsh and their son John, but on 5th Sept he appointed William Hynde and Thomas Rothwell as his legal representatives in a lawsuit against the Walshes concerning 3 acres of land and two acres of meadow in Purley Parva (ref 157-20270; 26-iii-420)
