



## ***Account of Purley on Thames***

### **Chronicles 1425-1449**

*1425 - 3/4 Hy VI*

*1426 - 4/5 Hy VI*

*1427 - 5/6 Hy VI*

Thomas Walsh and his wife Alice and son John were pardoned after paying five marks (in the hanaper) for acquiring to themselves and their heirs from Reginald Malyns, and entering without licence, the Manor of Little Purley. A licence was granted to the Walshes to have and to hold the premises. (ref 100)

*1428 - 6/7 Hy VI*

Thomas Walshe was still holding the Manor of Purley Parva (ref 26-iii-420)

The estate of Fulscot was held by Nicholas Carew by service of one sparrowhawk or payment of two shillings (refs Feudal Aids-i-65; 26-iii-502; 106-65)

*1432 - 10/11 Hy VI*

Nicholas Carew (II) (The Elder) died and the lordship of the manor passed to his son Nicholas (III), with contingent remainder to the heirs of Thomas Carew, his son by his second wife Mercy (refs 26-iii-419; 4-1432-189)

*1433 - 11/12 Hy VI*

The manor of Purley Parva had passed to Reynold Barentyne, the son of Thomas and Joan Barentyne, who had been named in the settlement of 1386 (Court Roll portf 212 no 7; 26-iii-420)

Thomas Geoffray exchanged livings with John Ferby, vicar of Little Bookham in Surrey. He remained there until he died in 1466 (Ref 115-1433-39d)

*1434 - 12/13 Hy VI*

*1435 - 13/14 Hy VI*

*1436 - 14/15 Hy VI*

The vicarage of Purley had been vacant and priests from Pangbourne and St Laurence in Reading had been ministering there. William Bolton was appointed as Vicar on the presentation of William Spaldyngton, provost of St Edmund's College in Salisbury (ref 115)

*1437 - 15/16 Hy VI*

*1438 - 16/17 Hy VI*

*1439 - 17/18 Hy VI*

Richard Cotton became vicar after the previous vicar, William Bolton had resigned. (ref 115)

*1440 - 18/19 Hy VI*

The valor of Nicholas Carew's manor was recorded in a charter (ref 157-23023)

*1441 - 19/20 Hy VI*

*1442 - 20/21 Hy VI*

*1443 - 21/22 Hy VI*

*1444 - 22/23 Hy VI*

John Braace became vicar of Purley after Richard Cotton had resigned. He had been vicar of St Mary le Butts in Reading
