



## ***Account of Purley on Thames***

### **Chronicles 1475-1499**

*1475 - 14/15 Edw IV*

*1476 - 15/16 Edw IV*

John Conyng, rector of Pangbourne was granted a Papal dispensation to hold Pangbourne and one other benefice (ref 322)

John Strete, former vicar of Purley, was granted a Papal dispensation to hold Hinton St George in the diocese of Bath and Wells and one other living (ref 322)

*1479 - 18/19 Edw IV*

Sir William Norris was fined six pence for not attending a court. He had succeeded to the manor of Purley Magna either in this year or 1478 (ref 24-79)

*1483 - 22/23 Edw IV / 1 Edw V / 1 Rich III*

*1484 - 1/2 Ric III*

Nicholas Carew (V) came of age in September (Chan Inq pm 2 Rich III no 44)

*1485 - 2/3 Rich III / 1 Hy VII*

Nicholas Carew (V) died childless and his heirs were his three sisters, Sanchia (wife of Sir John Iwardby) who inherited Purley Magna; Elizabeth (wife of Walter Twynhoo) who inherited La Hyde and Anne Tropnell (ref 26-iii-419)

On Sunday August 21st was fought the Battle of Bosworth in which King Richard III was killed. This victory by Henry VII settled the Wars of the Roses which had been dragging on for many years.
